Remonumentation of Certain Original Corner Points,
T. 5 S., R. 38 E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

from which new bearing trees

A ponderosa pine, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 3° E., 56¼ lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S22 BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 33 lks. dist., mkd. ¼ S15 BT.

Deposit corner stone and set a steel fence post alongside aluminum post.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 15, monumented with the original basalt stone, 12 x 8 x 6 ins., firmly set 4 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A root hole, bears S. 48° W., 8 lks. dist., with a decayed larch alongside, size indeterminate, with illegible scribe marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

Deposit corner stone and set a steel fence post alongside aluminum post.

The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, determined from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A larch, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 26 lks. dist., with scribe marks S 32 visible on open blaze. (Record, S. 55° W.)

A sawed pine stump, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 36° W., 67 lks. dist., no marks visible. (Record, N. 40° W.)

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 15 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, in a mound of stone, ¾ st. base, to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

57 lks. dist., no marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 21
ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum
cap mkd.

Corner is located in a fence line, extending N. and S.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 29, monumented with the
original basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 4 ins., firmly set 10
ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the
remains of the original bearing trees:

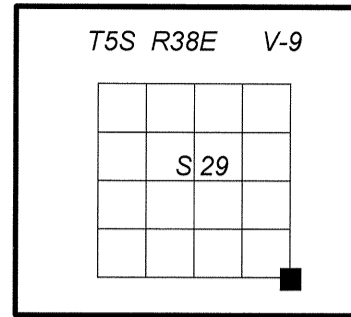
A ponderosa pine, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 89° E.,
158 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record,
165 lks.)

A sawed pine stump, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 10½° W.,
244 lks. dist., no marks visible.

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Original corner set by William B. Barr, under GLO Contract No. 388, approved December 31, 1881.
 Record States: Set Stake 4 ft long 4 in diam. 18 in ground for corner to sec 28, 29, 32, 33, from which:
 Tamarack, 18 inch in diam., bears S 55° W, 26 lks dist.
 Tamarack, 20 inch in diam., bears S 37° E, 22 lks dist.
 Pine, 3 inch in diam., bears N 60° E, 3 lks dist.
 Pine, 40 inch in diam., bears N 40° W, 67 lks dist.

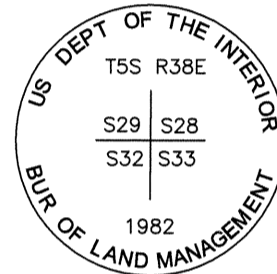


Subsequent Monumentation

Corner was remonumented by Scott R. McIntyre, under BLM Group No. 1000, approved December 27, 1983.
 Record States: The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, determined from the remains of the original bearing trees:
 A larch, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 26 lks. dist., with scribe marks 8 32 visible on open blaze. (Record, S. 55° W.)
 A sawed pine stump, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 36° W., 67 lks. dist., no marks visible. (Record, N. 40° W.)
 At the corner point: Set an aluminum post 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 15 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, in a mound of stone, 3 1/2 st. [sic] base, to top, with aluminum cap mkd. (as shown below), from which new bearing trees:
 A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 88° E., 132 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S28 BT.
 A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 44° E., 85 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S33 BT.
 A larch, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 18° W., 69 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S29 BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2 1/2 ins. diam. alum. pipe, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with 3 ft diam. stone mound to top, with a standard BLM 3 1/4 ins. diam. alum. cap, marked as shown:
 From the recovered monument I find the original bearing trees:
 A larch, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 26 lks. dist., alive and healthy, with "S32" visible in open upper blaze, tree has wire around, part of old fence.
 A sawed pine stump, 45 ins. diam., bears N. 36° W., 67 lks. dist., burnt on outside, no scribing visible. And accessories mkd. by McIntyre:
 A white fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 88° E., 132 1/2 lks. dist., alive with a dead top and "5S R38E S28 BT" visible on an open blaze.
 A root hole, bears S. 44° E., 85 lks. dist., with a fir 10 ins. diam. alongside, laying on blaze.
 A larch, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 18° W., 69 lks. dist., alive and healthy, with healed single blaze.
 Found guard post ±2.5 ft. E'ly.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate original location of this corner:

New bearing tree:
 A larch, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 42 1/2° E., 63.7 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S33 BT
 New bearing tree marked on a single blaze and has a nail with a brass washer stamped "LS 2648" right side center for distance measurements.
 Painted 6 ins. red bands and added Bearing Tree (54-3) and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs as needed to all bearing trees.
 Auto C/A geographic position:
 Lat. 45°05'38.0" N
 Long. 118°04'34.5" W
 I hereby certify that the corner is monumented and accessories taken as described, using a Warren Knight staff compass, set with 15° East declination, and steel tape on June 14, 2014.
