The  $\frac{1}{3}$  sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 33, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the eriginal bearing trees:

- A pine snag, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 20° E., 18 lks. dist., with scribe marks & S BT visible on open blaze.
- A saved pine stump, 36 ins. diam., bears M. 75° W., 57 lks. dist., so marks visible.

At the corner point

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 21 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum cap mkd.

Corner is located in a fence line, extending M. and S.

The 's sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 29, monumented with the original basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 4 ins., firmly set 10 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

- A ponderosa pine, 21 ins. diss., bears N. 89° E., 158 lks. dist., with healed blase. (Record, 165 lks.)
- A saved pine stump, 40 inc. blam., bears 8. 104° W. 244 lks. dist., no marks visible.

### History of original corner establishment:

Original corner set by William B. Barr, under GLO Contract No. 388, approved December 31, 1881.

Record States: Marked basalt rock12x8x6 for 1/4 sec corner, from which:

Pine, 36 in diam., bears S 20° E, 18 lks dist. Pine, 36 in diam., bears N 75° W, 57 lks dist.

#### Subsequent Monumentation

Corner was remonumented by Scott R. McIntyre, under BLM Group No. 1000, approved December 27, 1983.


Record States: The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 33, determined at record bearing and distance from the remains of the original bearing trees:

A pine snag, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 20° E., 18 lks. dist., with scribe marks ¼ S BT visible on open blaze.

A sawed pine stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 75° W., 57 lks. dist., no marks visible. At the corner point: Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 ½ ins. diam., 21 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum cap mkd. (as shown below) from wich new bearing trees:

A ponderosa pine, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E., 37 lks. dist., mkd 1/4 S33 BT.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 66° W., 31 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S28 BT.



## Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2½ ins. diam. alum. pipe, projecting 6 ins. above ground, in rock collar, with standard BLM 3½ ins. diam. alum. cap, marked as shown:

From the recovered monument I find the original bearing tree remains:

A rotting 6 ft. high pine stump, bears S. 20° E., 18 lks. dist., with scribing visible on open double blaze.

A stump, bears N. 75° W., 57 lks. dist. to face, with burn marks and no visible scribe. And accessories mkd. by McIntyre:

A ponderosa pine, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 24° E., 37 lks. dist., alive and healthy, with scribing visible on a partially healed blaze.

A white fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 66° W., 311/2 lks. dist., alive and healthy, with healed blaze.

Found guard post ±2 ft.Wly with Land Survey Monument (54-9) sign attached.



## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate original location of this corner:

New Bearing Trees:

A ponderosa pine, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 32° E., 33.4 ft. dist., mkd. 1/4 S28 BT. A ponderosa pine, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 52° W., 111.1 ft. dist., mkd. 1/4 S33 BT.

All new bearing trees are marked on a single blaze and have a nail with a brass washer stamped "LS 2648" right side center for distance measurements.

Painted 6 ins. red bands and added Bearing Tree (54-3) and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs as needed to all bearing trees

Auto C/A geographic position: 45°05'35.6" N Long. 118°03'54.1" W

I hereby certify that the corner is monumented and accessories taken as described, using a Warren Knight staff compass, set with 15° East declination, and steel tape on June 13, 2014.
