

The remains of the original Barr bearing trees:
A 12" Ponderosa Pine Stump, rotted, no marks visible, bears S 18°W 66.0 feet,

And a 14" Ponderosa Pine, dead and down, with scribing "27" visible on a previously opened blaze, bears approximately

N 10°W 41 feet.

The original S.E. and N.E. bearing trees, found in 1977 to be Ponderosa Pine Stumps, have rotted away.
