History of original corner establishment:

Surveyors General's notes state: "Set post corner to Secs. 31 & 36 and Townships 5 South Ranges 37 & 38 East, on West side of high ridge corner N.& S. from which corner a Tamarack 30 inch in dia. bears N20E, 28 lks. dist. a White Fir 12 inch in dia. bears N60°W, 36 lks. dist. a Hemlock 30 inch in dia. bears S45°E, 5 lks. dist."

# Description of corner evidence found:

Found no trace of wood post. Found 36" tamarac, opened blaze and good scribed BT. Measured S20°W, 18.5 ft. from which a 24" white fir stump bears N59°W, 23.8 ft. S45°E, 3' is down rotton spruce with old tags, 42" diamater. 54-3s on old BTs.

# Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At center of above described point set 2 1/2" x 30" galvanized pipe and brass cap marked; Set pipe 24" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap. From which, by magnetic declination of N20°E: An 8" lodgepole pine bears N52°W, 61.1 ft. scribed T5SR37E S36 BT. A 6" lodgepole pine bears N78°E, 31.0 ft. scribed T5SR38E S31 BT. and brass washers stamped PLS 1051 on BTs. Placed 54-5 on tree 5' South. Painted blazes red and 6" red band around. Placed 54-3s

Placed 54-2 and 54-4 on steel fence post 5' West of corner.

A Fir 14 ins diam bears N60°W 36 lks dist S36 R37 BT

A Fir 34 ins diam bears S45°E 5 lks dist not marked

Corner was remonumented by Barry B. Barbour, LS 1051, as described by File No. 683-84R, filed December 6, 1979, in the records of the Union County Surveyor.

Record states: Found no trace of wood post. Found 36" tamarac [sic], opened blaze and good scribed BT. Measured S20°W, 18.5 ft. from which a 24" white fir stump bears N59°W, 23.8 ft. S45°E, 3' is down rotton [sic] spruce with old tags, 42" diamater [sic]. 54-3s on old BTs.

At center of above described point set 2½ " x 30" galvanized pipe and brass cap marked (as shown below): Set pipe 24" in the ground and mound of stone around to cap.

From which by magnetic declination of N20°E:

An 8" lodgepole pine bears N52°W, 61.1 ft. scribed T5SR37E S36 BT.

A 6" lodgepole pine bears N78°E, 31.0 ft. scribed T5SR38E S31 BT.

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2½ ins. diam. iron pipe, projecting 4 ins. above ground, in 3 ft. diam. mound of stone to top, with 21/2 ins. diam. brass cap, marked as shown:

From the recovered monument I find the original bearing tree remains:

A cut tamarack stump, bears N. 20° E., 18.5 ft. dist. to face, with BT visible on open blaze.

Rotten fir stump remains, bear N. 59° W., 23.8 ft. dist., no scribing visible

Recovered Barbour bearing tree:

A lodgepole pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 78° E., 31.0 ft. dist., alive and healthy, with full scribe visible on open double blaze and brass washer in lower blaze, mkd. PLS 1051.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate original location of this corner:

New bearing trees:

A white fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 251/4° E., 23.9 ft. dist., alive and healthy, with Attention (54-4) and Location Tag (54-5) signs attached, mkd. X BT on double blaze. A white fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 76¼° W., 38.2 ft. dist., mkd. X BT on double blaze. A lodgepole pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 32° W., 47.1 ft. dist., mkd. XBT.

Set guard posts ±5 ft W'ly with Property Boundary (54-2) and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs, and ±5 ft. E'ly with a Property Boundary (54-2) sign.

All new bearing trees are marked on a single blaze unless noted otherwise and have a nail with a brass washer stamped "LS 2648" right side center for distance measurements.
