CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

This $\frac{1}{4}$ corner was set by deputy surveyor D. P. Thompson, under Contract No. 103, dated Sept. 3, 1863. He states he set a post for $\frac{1}{4}$ corner in a mound of stone.

DIAGRAM

Description of corner evidence found:

At the assumed $\frac{1}{4}$ corner location I found a small mound of stone adjacent to an existing rock jack at the corner of an ancient fence. No other evidence was available.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

With no other evidence available and the corner position appears correct by survey, I accepted the center of the mound of stone to be the true $\frac{1}{4}$ corner location. I then set an Alum. cap on a 2" x 30" pipe, with a magnet fixed in the cap, at the corner location. I buried the pipe flush with the ground surface and placed a mound of stone 4 feet dia. and 2 feet high covering the monument. No bearing trees are available in the vicinity of this corner.
