Found a stump hole with 18" remnant of Pine log, bears South 68° East, a dist. of 6.60 ft. Dead and down with reverse BT scribe visible on remnant of decaying log. A 30" diam. Pine stump, bears North 42° West, a dist. of 49.5 ft, BT scribe visible.

DESCRIPTION OF ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:
