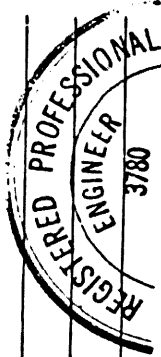

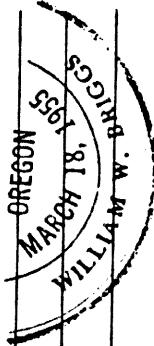

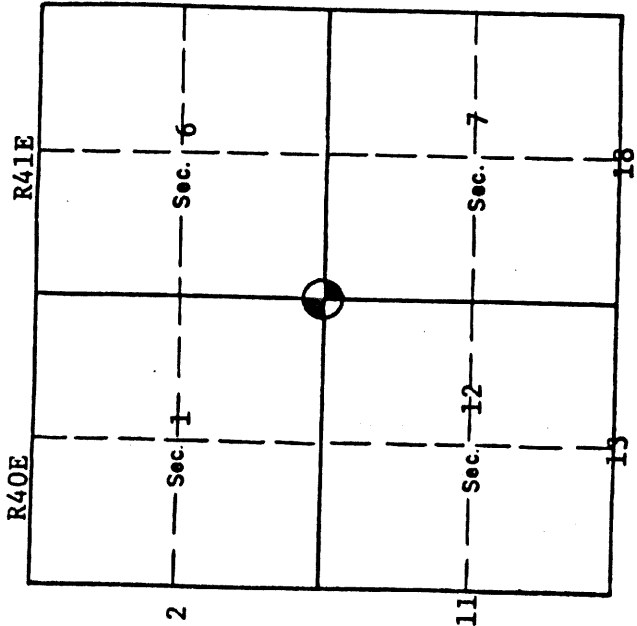

Set brass cap in concrete at intersection of the 4 compass lines. Set steel fence post along side corner.

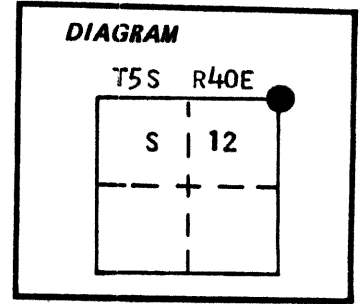

CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:
Set stone 24x12x10 for cor to secs 1,6,7 and 12
Raised stone mound at cor

Corner was remonumented June 10, 1975 by William W. Briggs His record states:
Set brass cap in concrete
Set steel fencepost along side corner



No record of subsequent remonumentation found in county records

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 3 1/2" brass plaque in concrete marked as shown below.

Corner falls 56 feet North of the North bank of Catherine Creek, 40 feet East of an existing North-South pole fenceline and 165 feet South of the centerline of State Highway Number 203

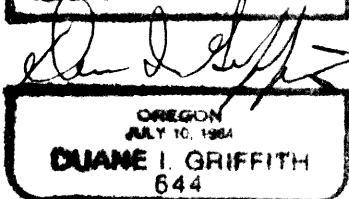
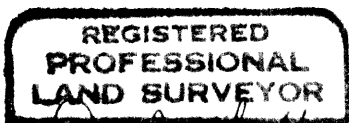
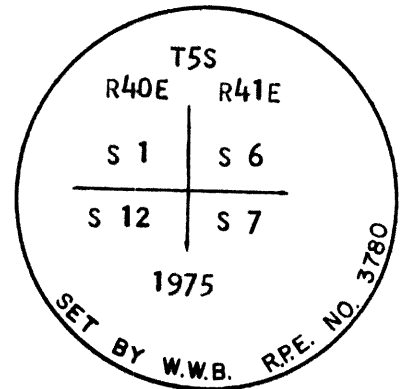
Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: From the existing corner monument as described above:

New BTs and B0s

- A 26 inch diameter P.Pine bears N34°E 46.98 feet with 3/8"x9" nail in right side
- A 19 inch diameter Cottonwood bears S64°E 28.26 feet with 3/8"x9" nail in right side
- A 5/8"x30" iron pin with plastic cap marked BGA SURVEY MARKER bears S56°W 50.58 feet 0.3 feet East of an existing fencepost (wooden)
- A 5/8"x30" iron pin with plastic cap marked BGA SURVEY MARKER bears N46°W 51.80 feet 0.3 feet East and South of an existing wooden fencepost

Did not scribe or paint trees as this corner falls in Catherine Creek State Park.

Corner rehabilitated May 28, 1986

Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 20° East magnetic declination. The distances to the BTs are to the nail driven in the right side of the tree, when facing the tree.

LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner established:

Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879.

Set stone 24x12x10 for cor secs 1,6,7 and 12
Raised stone mound at cor

Corner was remonumented June 10, 1975 by William W. Briggs.
His record states:
Set brass cap in concrete
Set steel fence post along side corner

Corner Bearing Trees and Reference Points set by Duane Griffith May 28, 1986.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey record.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 3-1/2" brass plaque in concrete marked as shown below.

Found a 28-inch (26-inch) diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N34°E 46.98 feet with (3/8"x9") nail in right side.

Found a 22-inch (20-inch) diameter Cottonwood bears S64°E 28.3 feet, no nail found but nail hole evident on right side.

Found 5/8" iron rod with plastic cap marked BGA SURVEY MARKER bears S56°W 50.50 (50.58) feet and is 0.3 feet East of wood fence post.

Found 5/8" iron rod with no plastic cap bears N46°W 51.60 (51.80) feet and is 0.3 feet East and South of wood fence post.

Corner lies 56 feet North of the north bank of Catherine Creek, 40 feet East of a north-south pole fence, 165 feet South of the centerline of State Highway Number 203 and at the back (West) of Catherine Creek State Park vehicle pad for campsite number 3, just below ground surface.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the existing corner monument as described above:

Accessories set:

Railroad spike on north side of concrete form around corner monument.

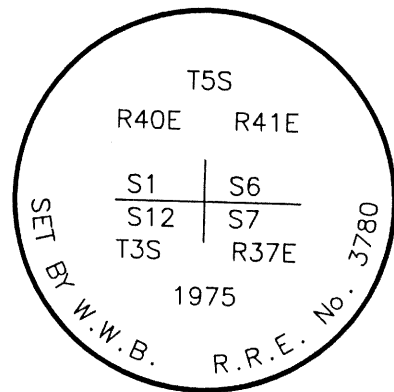
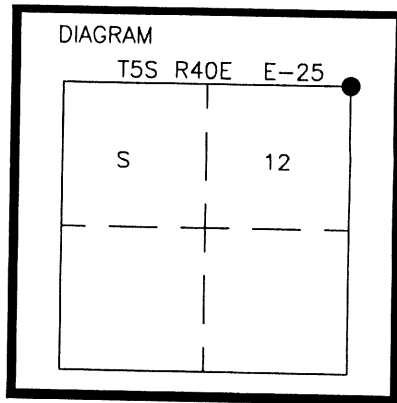
Section 6 – RP: 5/8" by 30" iron rebar with red plastic cap stamped STATE PARK TRAVERSE POINT set to the right side of a 33-inch Ponderosa Pine, the rod bears N8°E, 33.30 feet.

– BT: placed an Oregon State Parks Bearing Tree tag on a 28-inch (26-inch) diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N34°E 46.98 feet with (3/8"x9") nail in right side.

Section 7 – RP: 5/8" by 30" iron rebar with red plastic cap stamped STATE PARKS TRAVERSE POINT on the right side of a 22-inch (20-inch) diameter Cottonwood bears S64°E 28.3 feet, placed an Oregon State Parks bearing tree tag on Cottonwood with reference to iron rod as S57°E 28.21 feet.

Section 12– RP: set carsons site survey monument post behind found 5/8" iron rod with plastic cap marked BGA SURVEY MARKER bears S56°W 50.50 feet and is 0.3 feet East of wood fence post.

Section 1– RP: set carsons site survey monument post behind found 5/8" iron rod with no plastic cap bears N46°W 51.60 feet and is 0.3 feet East and South of wood fence post.
