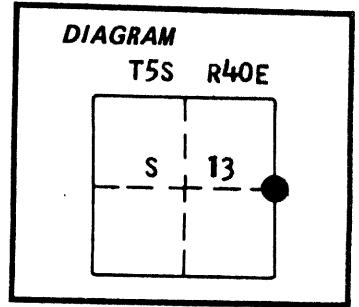


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:
Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Set stone 17x13x11 for 1/4 sec cor from which:

- A fir 6 in dia bears N30°W 6 lks dist
- A tamarack 16 in dia bears S28°E 19 lks dist



No record of subsequent monumentation found in county records

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone 13x11x9 inches marked 1/4 S

BTs are rotted beyond recognition

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: In place of stone, I set a 2 1/2"x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 30 inches in the ground with small mound of stone, from which:

New BTs

- A Tamarack 9 inches in diameter bears S88°E 63.73 feet marked 1/4 S18 BT
- A 13 inch diameter Red Fir bears N21°W 13.81 feet marked 1/4 S13 BT

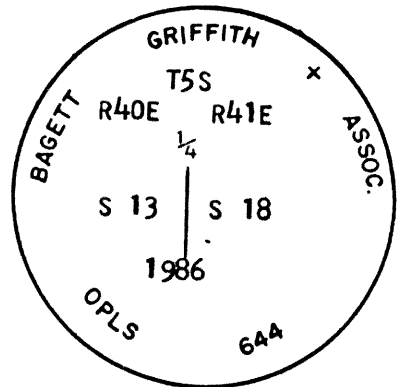
Buried the original stone North and alongside of monument
Set steel fencepost approximately 5 feet North with 54-4 sign

	The marks BXO on a rock outcrop, 2 ft. x 2 ft. x 1½ ft. above ground, placed there by Duane I. Griffith, Registered Land Surveyor No. 644, in 1986, bear S. 8½° E., 58½ lks. dist.															
	A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 62° W., 44 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R40E S13 BT.															
	A ponderosa pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 20° W., 24 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R40E S12 BT.															
	From this point, a point established as the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18 by W. W. Briggs, Oregon Registered Engineer No. 3780, in 1975, bears S. 7° 36' W., 0.249 chs. dist. This position was established by improper methods and is not utilized in this survey; monumented with a brass cap, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in cement flush with the ground surface, with top mkd.
