
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by H.M. Thatcher under GLO contract Number 320, dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Set stone 15x18x9 inches for 1/4 cor.

Raised Stone Mound at Cor.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

A stone, 7x10x18", mkd '1/4', lying loose next to mound of stone.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the mound of stone, I set a 2 1/2" x 30" Aluminum pipe with cap marked as shown, 18" in the ground, with mound of stone 3 ft. wide, from which:

NEW BEARING TREES:

An 8" Douglas Fir bears North 27° East, a distance of 38.36 feet, marked 1/4 S21 BT. An 8" Ponderosa Pine bears South 61° East, a distance of 45.51 feet, marked 1/4 S21 BT. A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears South 7° West, a distance of 16.78 feet, marked X BT. A 17" Douglas Fir bears North 28° West, a distance of 74.57 feet, marked 1/4 S21 BT.

I buried the stone alongside the pipe on the North side.

Corner falls 15' Northeast of a logging road on a steep Northeast facing slope.


