A Larch, 14" dia., (12" Larch S50 1/2°E, 10 lks) S57 1/2°E, 6.6 ft., scribed: 1/4 S22 BT. A Larch, 12" dia., (12" Larch N59 1/2°W, 26 lks) N50°W, 17.0 ft., scribed: 1/4 S21 BT.

Blazes open and scribing visible.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set steel fence post with Land Survey Monument (54-9) sign 3' from the monument.



Nailed Bearing Tree (54-9) signs above blaze and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs on back of each tree as required. Painted a 6" red band above Bearing Trees.





HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by H.M. Thatcher under GLO contract Number 320, dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states: Set stone 15x13x9 for 1/4 Sec. Cor. Raised Stone Mound at Cor.

In 1991, Philip G. Griffin conducts dependent resurvey, under BLM Special Instructions dated July 13, 1979, June 26, 1990 and Supplemental Special Instructions dated May 14, 1991, Groups No. 1000 and 1484. BLM records state:

Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 ½ ins. Diam., 22 ins. In the ground, and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

And new bearing trees: A Douglas Fir, 10" dia., bears S. 80° W., 35.0 ft., scribed 1/4 S21 BT. A Douglas Fir, 7" dia., bears N. 85° $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 11.5 ft., scribed 1/4 S22 BT.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND: Found a 3" B.L.M. brass cap on 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe, flush with the ground in a mound of stone, marked as shown, from which,

A 10" Douglas Fir bears North 17° East, a distance of 11.4 feet, with a healed blaze.

A 14" Western Larch bears South 51° East, a distance of 7.3 feet, with a healed blaze.

A 14" White Fir bears South 12° West, a distance of 21.7 feet, with a healed blaze.

A 16" Western Larch bears North 50° West, a distance of 17.8 feet, with scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.


