


History of original comer establishment: Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: At proportionate position, I set a 2½ x300 aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 28 inches in the ground with mound of stone 2 ft. base to top of cap from which:

A 8 inch diameter White Fir bears \$30°E 26.22 feet marked T5\$ R41E \$30 BT


A 19 inch diameter Red Fir bears S340W 47.29 feet marked T5S R40E S25 BT on single blaze
