
## **CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION**

## History of original corner establishment:

40.29 The  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 29, monumented with the original slate stone, 17 x 11 x 3 ins. (record, 17 x 13 x 5 ins.), loosely set, projecting 14 ins. above ground, with illegible chisel marks on one face, from which an original bearing tree:

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N.25°E., 10 lks. dist. with mostly healed blaze and no marks visible in rotten center.

At the corner point set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap, from which:

A larch, 25 ins. diam., bears N.79½°W., 116½ lks. dist. mkd. ½ S29 BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base of the stainless steel post.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 2½ " B.L.M. brass cap, 3" above ground from which:

A larch, 25" diam., bears N.79°30'W., 76.89', scribed "\$S29BT".

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

A fir, 19" diam., bears N.40°42'W., 38.18', scribed "\\$S29BT". A fir, 15" diam., bears S.18°39'W., 29.81', scribed "\\$S29BT".
