
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

40.35 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 27, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{4}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap, from which:



A larch, 10 ins. diam., bears N.28¾°E., 22 lks. dist. mkd. ¾ S27 BT.

A larch, 11 ins. diam., bears N.79½°W., 12 lks. dist. mkd. ½ S27 BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base of the stainless steel post.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 2½ "B.L.M. brass cap, 8" above ground from which:

A tamarack, 11" diam., bears N.78°43'W., 8.48',with a 1.5' blaze scribed "\s27BT". A tamarack, 10" diam., bears N.28°26'E., 14.17', with a 1.25' blaze, scribed "\s26BT".

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

A tamarack, 9" diam., bears S.64°00'E., 16.58', scribed "\$S26BT". A tamarack, 12" diam., bears S.14°21'W., 25.68', scribed "\$ S27BT".
