**Remonumentation of an Original Corner Point,
T. 5 S., R. 41 E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon**

CHAINS

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12 on the E. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with the original slate stone, 14 x 12 x 5 ins. (record, 14 x 10 x 6 ins.), loosely set at the center of an ancient stone mound, with 5 notches on the S. edge.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

A ponderosa pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 68½° E.,
132 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R42E S6 BT.

A ponderosa pine, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 36° E.,
59 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R42E S7 BT.

A ponderosa pine, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 12° W.,
102 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R41E S12 BT.

A ponderosa pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 8° W.,
117 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R41E S1 BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base and the corner stone alongside the stainless steel post.

The corner is located on a SE. slope, 1.00 ch. S. of a spur, sloping S. 60° E.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land encompassed in this resurvey lies in Union County, Oregon, ten miles southeast of the town of Union. The township is hilly with some steep mountains and precipitous canyons. Elevations range from 3200 feet above sea level at Catherine Creek in the northwest part of the township, to 5400 feet above sea level near the tops of Frazier Mountain and Reeves Mountain. Catherine Creek drains the terrain northwesterly to the Grande Ronde River. Oregon State Highway No. 203 crosses the township from section 7 through section 34.

The vegetation consists mostly of fir, pine, and larch timber, most of which has been logged at least twice, with an understory of young trees, bushes, grass, and wild strawberries. Much of the remaining timber is unhealthy because of an insect infestation.
