
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

SURVEYED BY: P. GRIFFIN, 1993, GROUP NO. 1000 AND 1484

Beginning at the standard cor. of Tps. 5 S., Rs. 41 and 42 E., monumented with the original slate stone, 30 x 12 x 8 ins., loosely set 6 ins. in the ground in the original hole, with parts of bottom broken away, mkd. with 6 notches on the N., S., and E. edges, SC on the S. face, 41 on the NW. face, and 42 on the NE. face.



At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 21/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap

From which:

A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N.2½°E., 174 lks. dist. mkd. T5S R42E S31 SC BT. A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N.4°W., 30 lks. dist. mkd. T5S R41E S36 SC BT.

Deposit the corner stone alongside the stainless steel post.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 3" BLM brass capped pipe, cap marked per diagram, monument 6" above the ground, with no stones, from which:

A fir, 13" diam., bears N.04°07'W., 19.81', scribed "T5S R41E S36 SC BT" A fir. 16" diam., bears N.02°04'E., 115.12', scribed "T5S R41E S36 SC BT".

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

A fir, 13" diam., bears S.75°00'E., 43.17', with a 12" x 4" blaze, scribed "BT". A fir, 16" diam., bears S.37°08'W., 115.75', with a 12" x 4" blaze, scribed "X BT".



A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N.2¼°E., 174 lks. dist. mkd. T5S R42E S31 SC BT. A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N.4°W., 30 lks. dist. mkd. T5S R41E S36 SC BT.

Deposit the corner stone alongside the stainless steel post.

CHAINS

Detectable Electronically Energized Particles (DEEP-1 TM) were buried as memorials at certain corner monuments. The DEEP-1 is composed of strontium encased in a color coded plastic container. The units are 1 inch in diameter, $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches long, weigh $2\frac{1}{2}$ ounces, and are magnetically detectable to an average depth of 8 feet.

The geographic position (NAB 1927) of the standard corner of townships 5 south, ranges 40 and 41 east, as determined by a tie to the United States Geological Survey triangulation station "REEVES," is as follows:

Latitude 45° 04' 45.20" N. Longitude 117° 44' 37.56" W.

The mean magnetic declination is 20° East.
