
History of original corner establishment: Original corner established in 1884 by William B. Barr.

29.5" dead standing Fir bears S60°E, 31 lks., face healed and did not open.

14" green Ponderosa Pine bears S45°W, 40 lks., open blaze scribed: T6S R35 1/2E S16.

30" decayed stump bears N30°W, 75 lks., no marks.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set 2.5"x30" aluminum capped aluminum pipe stamped:

Pipe rises 8" above ground.
Set steel fence post 3 ft. north of corner.


