Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At the position of the corner I set a 2" galvanized pipe 30" long with a bronze cap on top and 8" plated welded to bottom. The pipe set to a denth of 24" and back filled with tamped soil.

I stamped the disk

From the monument the original bearing tree is; A black pine 12" in diam bears N23°W 28 lks dist. I set the following additional bearing trees.
