Found a stump hole and partially burned tree of size lying downhill of hole for Section 5 bearing tree. The bottom 20 feet of this tree has been burned and no markings visible.

AFFIDAVIT TO THE COUNTY SURVEYOR, UNION COUNTY, OREGON
