
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

10.705 Point for the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, T6S R41E, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor. Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 21/2 ins. diam., 22 ins in the ground, with brass cap, from which:



A larch, 14 ins. diam., bears S.121/4°E., 65 lks. dist. mkd. T6S R41E S1 CC BT. A ponderosa pine, 20 ins. diam., bears S.4½°W., 99 lks. dist. mkd. T6S R41E S2 CC BT.

Deposit a white "DEEP-1" magnetic marker at the base of the stainless steel post.

From this point, the corner of wire fences, extending S. and W., bears N.251/4°E., 0.850 chs.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 3" BLM brass capped pipe, cap marked per diagram, 5" above ground, no stone mound, from which:

A larch, 11" diam., bears S.12°02'E., 43.24', with a 19" x 3" blaze, scribed "T6S R41E S1 BT". A pine, 15" diam., bears S.04°19'W., 65.34', with a 24" x 5" blaze, (not legible).

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

> A pine, 11" diam., bears N.58°25'W., 20.99', with a 10" x 4" blaze, scribed "BT". A pine, 9" diam., bears N.20°48'E., 48.27', with a 10" x 4" blaze, scribed "X BT".
