Fourth Judicial Day Saturday July 28. 1882

Court met pursuant to adjournment with the same Officers present as of yesterday.

Due proclamation of the opening of Court having been made - yesterday's proceedings were read and are now signed,

Whereupon the following proceedings were had

In the matter of appropriation
for Ladd Hill County Road

Now at this time appeared R. L. Newman and presents to the Court the petition and subscription list of Citizens residing and interested in the above named County Road and asks the Court to make an appropriation from the County fund equal to the amount subscribed thereon by the Citizens to wit the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) to be expended on said road and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the amount of Road work due in the Road District in which said County Road is located is wholly inadequate to make the necessary repairs and keep the same in proper traveling condition it is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Court that orders be drawn on the County Treasurer of this County for a sum equal to the amount paid on subscription not exceeding the sum of Five Hundred Dollars - to be expended on the County Road leading up the Ladd Canyon between the mouth thereof and the summit of the Hill between Ladd Creek and that

be appointed to superintend said work and disburse the funds subscribed and appropriated thereon and further that upon the presentation of an order signed by said Superintendent, that the amount therein stated is due, the Clerk of this Court is hereby authorized to issue and deliver to such party or parties

the sum or sums - so certified to be due without further order of this Court. It is further ordered that the Clerk furnish said Superintendent with a certified Copy of this order. -

In the matter of Extra }

Now on this day comes J. P. Outhouse and asks the Court for Extra Compensation for services rendered as School Superintendent of Union County and it appearing that the usual salary for services performed by the Superintendent of Public Schools in Union County has formally been Three Hundred Dollars (300⁰⁰) per Annum. and that said amount is totally inadequate as Compensation for the services necessary to be performed in discharging the duties of said office - it is therefore ordered that the Clerk of this Court audit and deliver to said J. P. Outhouse, in County warrants the sum of (150⁰⁰) One hundred & Fifty Dollars as salary for the six months ending July 1st 1882 and the further sum of (90⁰⁰) Ninety Dollars as extra Compensation for the year ending July 1st 1882
