Dear Sir, — herewith I send you a Road petition, Board &c. I have failed to get a copy of the Notices owing to the deep snow and no roads broken and will have to depend on that one or the Court House door. Will you please get it and attach to the Affidavit enclosed of that one too should he gone could you possibly get the County Court to act on it, it is one of the most important roads in the valley.

In case of the ^{proposed} road from Estes to Sheep Creek via Alder, we will make final acts to day but if our returns don't reach the County Court in time could you get the Court to give us till the next term to settle with Bloom? I have not got back McCully or Stickney yet they are out of the valley, will see them soon. You ought to be careful how you use firearms over these about Union. We don't do it that way in the Wallowa.





We found the Road to be located on as good ground as the section of Country over which the Road is laid will admit of and taking into consideration the necessity that exists for said Road - we recommend that it be established as a County Road



And it further appearing to the Court that said Riley had not appealed from the action of this Court so taken, and that the time for such appeal had long since expired. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said request be denied, and it is further ordered that the Supervisor of said Road District No 24 proceed without further delay to open said road according to law, and that the Clerk of this Court send a certified copy of this order to said supervisor.

E. Johnson situated on the South West 1/4 of said section Township and Range hence in South Eastly direction to the said South line of said Sec 33 a distance of about 22 rods and intersecting said line at a point 20 rods East of the 1/4 sec corner hence each on the section line about 300 rods to intersect the County road and that they meet at the residence of J. E.
