



Now at this time is presented to the Court the petition of G. D. Akin, Perry Gregg and thirty four other citizens of Union County praying for the location of a County Road as follows, to wit: As near as practicable on the following described route, to commence at a point near the mouth of Trout Creek where the County road leading from the town of Adler to the town of Goldino crosses said Trout Creek on the north bank of said Creek thence following allowing the Valley and up said Creek in a Northwesterly direction a distance of about one and a half miles to a point opposite Jess Overby's residence, thence up said Creek in a Northerly direction a distance of about four miles to a point at the south west corner of the south east quarter section 35 Brown 1 North Range 44 C. H. & B. thence in a Northerly direction up a gulch known by the name of Little Trout and over a脊 and down another gulch in nearly the same direction to Rees and Shremakers Sheep Ranch and on the East branch of Whiskey Creek a distance of about three miles and a half thence in a Northerly direction up said branch of Whiskey Creek over a divide and down to the lower end of Mud Prairie a distance of about six miles, thence to the Read Fur Springs in a North northeasterly direction a distance of about 11 miles and thence following as nearly as practicable along the old Perce trails in a Northerly direction to a point where said trails cross the line dividing Oregon from Washington Territory a distance of about 12 miles the terminus, all of which points and places are situated in the aforesaid County and State. 
