Whereas, a petition is now and has been
circulating to be presented to the County Court
of the above named County at its next
regular session asking for the location and
granting of a County Road commencing at
the Southwest corner of Southeast fourth
of Southeast fourth of Section 32 Town 1
South, R. 44 East Thence $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north
thence in a Northwesterly direction on the
most practicable ground to a point
North of the present residence of Henry
Miller and between the hill and ravine
on the North a distance of about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile
thence West and North between
said ravine and hill to bridge on the Willamette
River near the residence of W. A. Wood,
a distance of about 1 mile making a to-
tal distance of 2 miles more or less

Now therefore we whose names are
hereunto subscribed house holders and
legal voters within the State of Oregon
and living along the line and in the im-
mediate vicinity of the County road as
aforesaid do hereby request to be granted by your

Honorable Body Would most earnestly
yet respectfully remonstrate and protest
against the granting of said proposed
road for the following reasons

First The ground on which the road is
proposed to be located is much worse
ground for a road bed than where the
said road is at present it being for a
~~considerable distance on a steep and rocky~~
key hill side where it is next to im-
possible to construct and maintain a good
road and where the road is at present loca-
tion the ground is good for a road bed and
the work of the road bed is already done

Second The route is no shorter and
Third if the change proposed by the said
petition is granted several of the settlers
living along the line of the road prop-
osed to be changed will be cut off from
and entirely deprived of any public high-
way to their great damage

And fourth The change sought to be made
by the said petition will in no way add to
the convenience of the traveling public and
and consequently will add much expense
labor to the road district without any corre-
sponding benefits
