Now at this time was presented a petition of Terry Suttis and others praying for the location of a County Road Commencing at the ford above the Heebner Ranch and running on the most practicable route to the House of Henry Penick Thence west to the Section line dividing Sections Number 8 and 9 thence South Eighty rods thence west on the most practicable route to intersect the lane between Mrs. Patton and J. S. Morton Thence to the town of Sumnerville - Which petition being duly accompanied by an affidavit as to the posting of Notices according to law and also a bond duly accepted Wherefore it was ordered that said petition be granted and Charles Wells Henry Penick and George Williams were duly appointed to view said road to meet at Sumnerville on the 21st day of May 1869 and view said proposed road and J. S. Curtis appointed as Surveyor

In the matter of
a County Road

Now at this time was presented a petition of Jno. S. Post and others being a sufficient number of householders praying for a Change in a County road Commencing as follows viz Commencing at the South West Corner of Briggs Ranch and running East to the South East Corner of said ranch directly on the Survey of the Uniontown road from thence South on the most and best ground to the old road which petition was accompanied by a bond and oath Verifying as to the posting of Notices according to law Whereupon it was ordered that said petition be granted and it was ordered that Jacob Herman, J. T. McComas, Thomas Stacy be and they are hereby appointed to view said road to meet on the 19th day of May 1869 at ten o'clock Am. at Briggs Ranch to view said proposed Change in said road and J. S. Curtis appointed as Surveyor

At a regular term of the County Court of Union County Oregon held at the Court House in La Grande Oregon on the Sixth day of July 1869 there was present S. Alberson County Judge H. C. Craig Sheriff John McDowell County Commissioner and C. S. McClomas County Clerk

Now at this time it appearing to the Court that the Viewers heretofore appointed to view a County road, "Commencing at the ford above the Hubner ranch and running on the most practicable route to the House of Henry Henshaw thence west to the Section line dividing Sections Number Eight and Nine thence South Eighty rods thence west on the most practicable route to intersect the lane between Wm. Patton and S. S. Morton thence to the town of Summerville - have failed to receive their said Notice of appointment, it is therefore ordered that J. C. Standley, Chas. Wells, and C. A. Keelev be and they are hereby appointed as Viewers to view said road to meet at the town of Summerville the terminus of said road on Saturday July 24th at Eleven o'clock A.M. to view said proposed County Road

Now at this time was presented the report of the Viewers and Surveyor heretofore appointed to view and report on a County road running from Crockett to Union and said report being read on the first day was laid over until tomorrow

At a regular term of the County Court of Union County Oregon began and held at the Court House in La Grande Oregon on the 9th day of Sept 1869 there was present Hon S. Alberson County Judge John Mc Dorrell County Commissioner A. C. Craig Sheriff and E. S. Mc Comas County Clerk

Due proclamation of the opening of Court having been made the following business was Transacted

In the matter of County Road from Heebner Ranch to ^{Summerville} ~~Summerville~~

Now at this time was taken up and read for the first time the report of the Viewers and Surveyor of a proposed County Road from the Heebner Ranch in said County to the town of Summerville

In the matter of a County road from La Grande to ^{McLaughlins mill} ~~McLaughlins mill~~

Now on this day was presented a petition praying for the location of a County Road as follows viz Commencing at the sign post about one and one fourth miles from the town of La Grande (cars) and running thence to the bridge on Catherine Cross near Hendersons point on the nearest and most practicable route thence to the Blacksmith Shop of St. Erins thence on the nearest and most practicable route via David Collier to Dodsons Store thence via McLaughlins mill to the Summit of the mountains on the nearest and most practicable route. Which petition having truly sworn along said proposed road and also being accompanied by a bond for the payment of all Expenses necessarily incurred as required by law and there being no remonstrance to said petition it was ordered that said petition be granted and that Frank Partness, F. Shoemaker and D. A. McAllister be and they are hereby appointed to view said road to meet at La Grande on Friday 17th Sept 1869 at ten o'clock J. L. Curtis was appointed as Surveyor

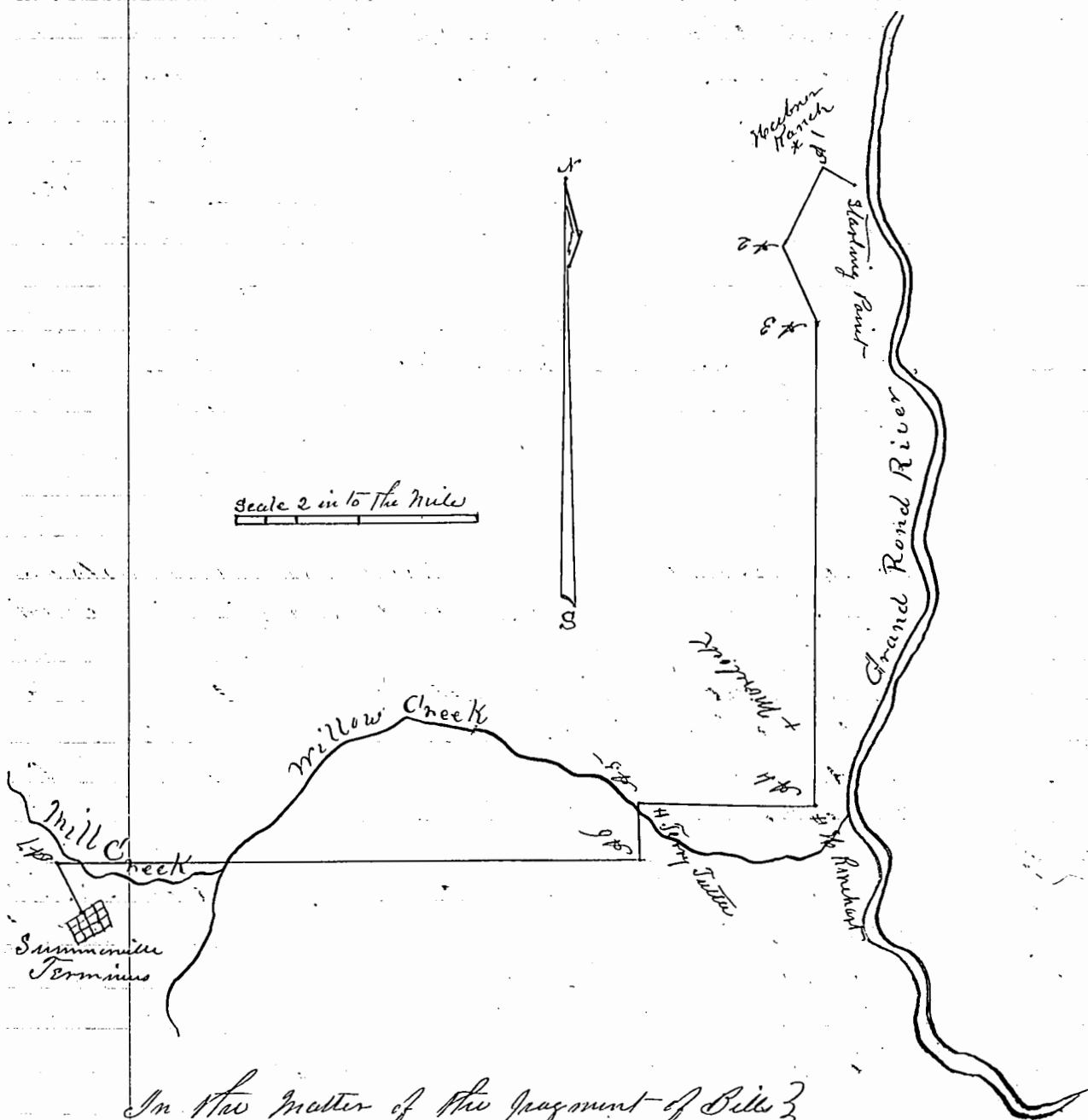

In the matter of a County Road $\frac{3}{2}$ Report of Viewers
 from Weeber Ranch to Summerville $\frac{3}{2}$ Second Reading

Now at this time the Report of the Viewers of the said Road having passed a second reading and no remonstrance having been made, and the said report having been in favor of opening of the said proposed Road, it is therefore ordered that said Road be opened and declared a Public Highway in accordance with the notes and Plot of the Survey of said Road, as follows:

The survey of the accompanying Plot of a County Road was made on the 24th day of July 1869 commencing at the Ford above the Weeber Ranch in Indian Valley at a stake placed on the west bank of the Grand Rond River and running thence N by 30° N 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ Chs to a Post No 1 thence S by 25° W 27 Chs to a Post No 2 thence S by 20° E 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ Chs to a P No 3 thence S by 3° W 2 Miles and 25 Chs to a P No 4 standing near the corner of the Rainharts and Terry Tracts land claims thence N 60 Chs to the See line between See 8 and 9 to a Post No 5 thence S 20 Chs to a Post No 6 thence N 2 Miles and 38 Chs to angle Post No 7 thence S by 30° E 7 Chs to the terminus of the Road at a stake standing on the Bank

of Mill Creek near the north side of the
Town of Summerville, Whole distance $7\frac{3}{4}$ Miles
