Dickman and Others for a second reading as provided by law, and such report being favorable and having been read on two different days of this term of Court, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the proceedings herein have been regular and according to law, and there being no remonstrance or bill or claims for damages filed herein; It is therefore ordered by the Court that said Viewers report and the plat of the surveyor be placed on record and said road be established as a County road and opened according to law, and that the supervisor of District No. be notified of the fact; and that the same be declared a public highway.

## Viewers Report

In accordance with an order of the Honorable County Court of the County of Union, we, the Viewers appointed to view Road petitioned for by J.E. Dickman and others did meet the Surveyor at the Post Office in the town of Joseph, Union County Oregon on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of June 1886, and after being duly sworn to faithfully perform the several duties of Chammens and Markers and Viewers did begin the same at the S.E. corner of Sec. 30, T. 2, S. R. 45 E. and continue the same two days and Adjourn until Monday the 21<sup>st</sup> day of June. Did meet on the day appointed and continue the same till completed, terminating thirty four rods west of S.W. corner of Sec. 8, T. 2, S., R. 45, E. The same was surveyed and marked according to law as Surveyors Report and Plat will more fully show.

We, your viewers, would most respectfully recommend the above named Road to be allowed, and ordered opened for the reason that we consider the same a practicable Road and one much needed by all the settlers on the Road.
