The undersigned householders of Union County Oregon residing in the vicinity where the hereinafter described road is proposed to be respectfully petition your Honorable body to lay out and establish a County road within said County on the following line or route to wit

Begging at a stake marked No. 1 near the County road at the Sa-Buff farm, about three hundred yards east of the Sa-Buff dwelling house, where the old road turns south and crossing the creek, and goes in a south easterly direction up what is known as the Drury gulch, keeping on the east side of said gulch to the farm of Geo. W. Simmon, passing through said farm in nearly the same direction, going between the house and stable of said Geo. W. Simmon, to the west line of Sec. 26, T. 3 S. R. 40 E. N. M. Thence south on said line to a stake marked No. 2, near the southwest corner of said Sec. Thence in a southeasterly direction on the most practicable route and terminating at a stake marked No. 3, about eighty rods east of the southeast corner of Sec. 36, T. 3 S. R. 40 E. N. M.

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT FOR UNION COUNTY, OREGON:


The undersigned viewers heretofore on the 17 day of May, 1888, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed County road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by A. B. Rees, et al, beg leave to report that on the 28th day of May, 1888, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should ~~not~~ be laid out or established as a public highway of UNION COUNTY, OREGON. That the same is ~~not~~ practicable and would ~~add~~ ~~not~~ add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof, we therefore recommend that said proposed road be ~~not~~ laid out nor declared a public highway of said county.

petitioners herein, to wit the sum of \$34.60 and that the parties on
the undertaking herein be notified to pay such sum to the County
Treasurer and produce and file with the Clerk the Treasurer's
