Thence running in a southwardly direction to a point 12 rods more or less south of the Grand Ronde River, thence casting on the most practicable ground or route to intersect the County road at a point near Wm. A. Arnolds ~~old~~ House also to discontinue the County road between the beginning and terminus of this <sup>proposed</sup> road, also to lay out a road lying on the County road near Wm. A. Arnolds saw mill and running casting on the west - east route to intersect the County road near Charles Sants Dwelling House also to discontinue what is now the County road between these two points of intersection.





It is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that a license issue to said T. C. Shea authorizing and empowering him to keep and sell spirituous malt and various liquors in the precinct of Cornucopia in quantities less than one quart for the period of six months from the date hereof.

Whereupon it was ordered that Court be now adjourned till tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock
