To the Honorable County Court of

thoroughfare to all points south.

In the matter of an  
Appropriation for the  
Road South of Summerville

This matter comes on to be heard upon the petition of S. L. McKenzie and 60 other taxpayers of Summerville and vicinity praying the Court to appropriate the sum of \$500. for the improvement of the County road leading South from the Town of Summerville to Willow Creek bridge, And it appearing to the Court from said petition that said County road is during the Spring and Fall of every year in an almost impassible condition, owing to the lowland and nature of the soil through which it passes, That said road ought to be gravelled for convenience of the travelling public residing in the vicinity thereof, That said road is one of the principal thoroughfares in the County and of very great importance to the people of the whole North and of Sande Ronde Valley, But it appearing further to the Court that the people living in the vicinity of said road should be specially interested in the road and ought to contribute towards said improvements, It is therefore ordered that the sum of \$250. be appropriated out of the County treasury for the graveling and improvement of said road provided that the people of Summerville and vicinity will contribute a like amount in money or labor upon said road. It is further ordered that R. Shaw, Supervisor of Road Dist. No 12 be appointed to superintend said work.

In the Matter of Extending  
the time for the payment  
of Taxes

It appearing to the Court that the Tax Roll was turned over to the Sheriff very late and that it was impossible to collect very much of the tax during the Fall and Winter, That the hard winter was disastrous to many stock men throughout the County who have not yet been able to pay their taxes, and that the time ought to be extended, It is therefore considered and ordered that the Sheriff be instructed to receive County warrants in payment of 13½ mills, the same being the County tax, up to the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1890, but that the 1½% allowed the sheriff for collecting said taxes be paid by the taxpayers from this date and not by the County as before this date.
