



At this time it is ordered by the
Court that the Clerk issue warrants on the County Treas-
urer Monthly, that is at the end of every month, for the
payment of salaries of all County officers whose salaries
are fixed by law including the salaries of the
County school Superintendent fixed by the County Court
at \$600⁰⁰ per year, And of Stock Inspector fixed by law
at \$800⁰⁰ per annum, And of County physician fixed
by contract at \$445⁰⁰ per annum, And salary of kept of
Poor Farm fixed by contract at \$500⁰⁰ per annum.
