



Inclused please find a map showing the union and Cernacopia, J. Baker, Luther LLoyd, Brown, Lee, and D. M. Tarter reads, it is the epinion of myself and others that \$1000.00 can be saved by commencing the Pine Creek Road to the Seven Devils, at the terminus of the J. Baker road. You will see that the H. J. Baker road intersects the Union & Cornucopia Road also the Luther Lleyd Road, which is already built. It will ets ten or twelve hundred dellars to build the D. M. Warter road from where it leaves the Frown Lee road to where it intersects the Baker road, and then it will not be as good a road as the other, I was teld that Mr. Henderson is in favor of running the Pine Creek read over the hills and down fish creek. I do not think that would be near as good a route as the one down the creek as there will be two very high hills to climb, the one coming out from fish creek raising one foot in four and . the ground is very soft until late in the spring, while to go down Pine from the terminus of the Baker road will give a light and uniform grade and a solid road bed. I have not changedmy opinion in regard to the cost of the road. I think it a harder road to build than the read from Sanger to Cornucipa, and I find that mest of the men who have been over the route think about as I do, I would kike very much to see the road built as I think it would be of great benefit to this part of the Country, but I am not anxious enought o mistroresent the facts in regard to the cost to the County Court, let them know the truth and then if they decide to build the road we will all say good.




I herewith inclose an order for the \$500.00 please hand it to Mr. Guild, I have just returned from a trip ever the road. They have about 4 miles yet to build. I think it will take them to the 20" of July to get to the landing. I am not satisfied with the road as it runs, around MrasMebaned place. Wen Mr. Ham came there Mr. McLean stood him alf and went ahead of the road workers on unserveyed government land and put up a temporary fence that crowded them entirely offxfrom the road survey into the hills for a distance of 2 miles and that spoils the entire road just as two or three bad hills spoils a claim. My opinion is that, that part of the road should be changed and pu ton the survey before the \$100@llowed and farther I am not willing to trust my judgment in receiving the road. There are so many against me that I cannot help but insist that it is the duty of yourself as one of the Commissioners to come out and go over the road with me. It is only a temporary affair with the Baker Road Co. but with · Union County it is permanent. We must receive it as a Co. road and be held responsible for its condition in the future. I can not convince myself that the Co. Court realize the magnitude of this road and the responsibility they wish me to assume it is like sending a lone Corporal out to contend with a half doz. Brigadiers with full command I think that they are entitled to the 500 and should have it to help them along, but I do not think that I will order the \$1000 until some member of the Co.
