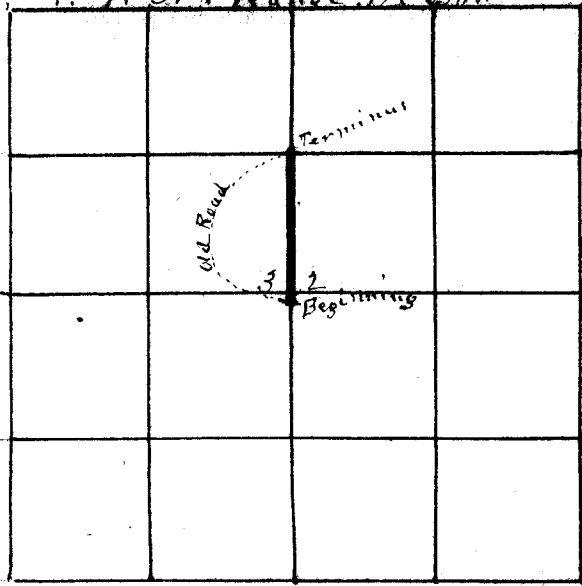
# REPORT OF VIEWERS.
