The undersigned viewers heretofore on the 9th day of March ; 1892, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by A Terwilliger, et al, beg leave to report that on the 25th day of March , 1892, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to, faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county.


