TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT FOR UNION COUNTY, OREGON:





Gentlemen;

I am informed that a Petition for a county road will be presented to your Honorable body on May 4th '92 asking you to lay out a county road from near the mouth of Looking Glass creek to a point at or near the cor. of Sec 24 Twp 2 N. R. 39 E, said road being petitioned for by Harrell, Swift et al. If said proposed road is allowed I desire to present a bill for damages for an amount not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.)

My reasons for asking damage are as follows: 1st It creates the necessity of erecting quite an amount of new fence as well as the removal of old fence, 2nd If allowed as asked for it separates my water from my pasture

Thereby depriving me of the use of
said pasture

3rd Separates my land into two
bodies, which it would cause me
great inconvenience.

Explanatory, If the proposed road had run
a few rods further west, where it crosses
my farm I could make a schute under
a bridge, for the passage of stock
thereby avoiding much of the objection-
ableness of the present proposed road,
Trusting that you may have a
fair showing in your delibera-
tions concerning the said road
