# REPORT OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT FOR UNION COUNTY, OREGON:

The undersigned viewers heretofore on the 5 day of April, 1893, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by A. B. Conley, doth beg leave to report that on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1893, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should change of be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county. and that portion of Road No 213 between angles 13 and 17 be truncated



Gilkison Road Master of said County, be furnished with a copy of this decree and ordered to allow old road to be closed when the said A. B. Conley places the new road in as good condition for travel as the old one.
