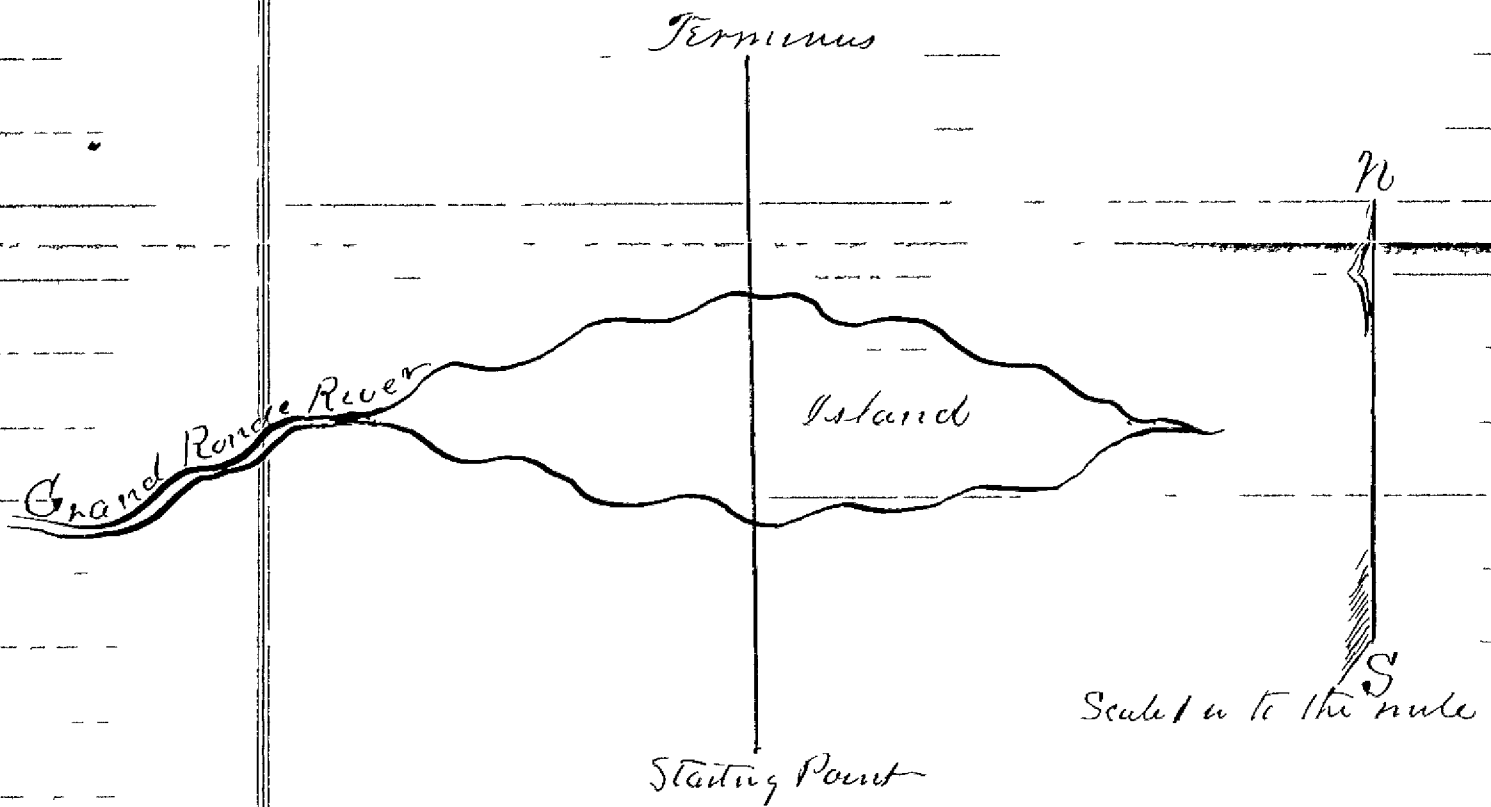

to view out a proposed County Road

Road from La Grand to the Cove
where the Range Line between ranges
38 and 39 crosses said Road and terminating
on the Road leading past Luke McGinnis'
House beg leave to report that we met
on the day appointed and after
being duly sworn adjourned until
the 30th inst. in consequence of the
weather being too stormy to complete
Our duties, and on the 30th inst we
again met and adjourned for the
same reason.

On the 2nd day of December
1871 we met and proceeded to view
out said proposed Road with J
S Curtis as Surveyor further that
we found the Road practicable only
for a summer Road at present
as some of the route is subject
to overflow during high water
The line of Road however would
be of great benefit to many of the
settlers if opened as they are

Compelled at present to trespass
upon their neighbors to gain access
to any of the County roads all
of which is respectfully submitted
with the accompanying notes and
plot of the Survey

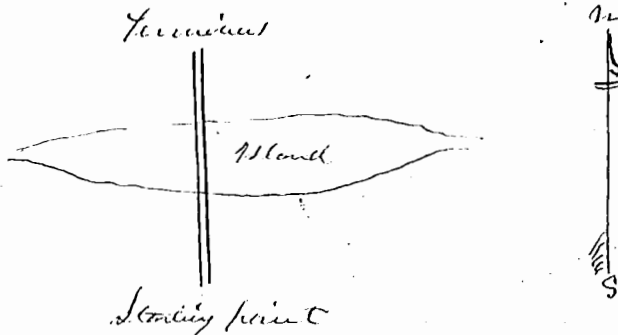
Now at this time comes

or on the road leading from Salgrande to the Cove
crosses the Range line dividing Ranges 38 and 39
East, thence North on said Range line to the
quarter section corner on the west line of Section
No. 30 T 2 S of Range 39 East or until it intersects
the Road running East and West by Majumder's
farm all of which points and places are in
Union County Oregon, which petition was
accompanied by a Bond in accordance with
the law, also by proof of the posting of
notices as the law requires duly verified.
It is therefore Ordered that John Wells Carson
Sommer J. D. Morrow be and they are hereby
appointed appointed Viewers, with J. L. Lunt's
Surveyor to view out and mark said proposed
County Road as the law requires who shall
meet at the House of Thos. O'Brien in Salgrand
on the 27th day of November 1871, and report
their doings at the next term of this Court.

Now at this time was presented Viewers Reports accompanied by plat and field notes of the Survey of a County Road commencing on the Road leading from Sulphur to the Cove, where said Road crosses the Range line dividing Ranges 38 and 39 East thence North on said Range line to the quarter Section corner on the west line of Section 30 Township 2 South of Range 39 East or until it intersects the Road running East & West by McFunnis' farm. It is therefore Ordered that the Report of said Viewers be granted and that the Road be and is hereby declared a public high way in accordance with the following field notes and plat of said Road.

Commencing at a Stake on the Margin of the County
Road leading from Galpando to the Cove and thence
running due North three Miles and 48 Chains
to the terminus marked by a post planted on the
Margin of the road leading past Luke McGinnis'
House and following the Range line between Ranges
38 and 39 & Mill Run the whole distance

In the Matter of receiving
Sealed Proposals for
Siding & Painting Court House

Now at this time it is ordered
that Sealed Proposals will be received at the Clerks
Office in Galpando until the first Monday in March
1872 for Siding or weatherboarding the Court House in
Galpando, and also for putting on three coats of white
paint on the same. The Bids for the Siding shall
be in one bid, and for the painting in a separate bid
The Bids shall contain how much per Square for
putting on good seasoned dressed siding, and the
Bid for painting shall also state the amount per
Square for three coats of paint, The Court reserving
the right to accept any of said bids, or of rejecting all
bids if deemed too high. It is further ordered
that the carpenters work shall be completed by the
30th day of April next, and the painting to be com-
pleted by the 8th day of May 1872

It is further ordered that the County Clerk post
three notices for the renewal of said Sealed
Bids one on the Court House one at the Post
Office and at the Mountain Exchange Hotel in
Galpando
