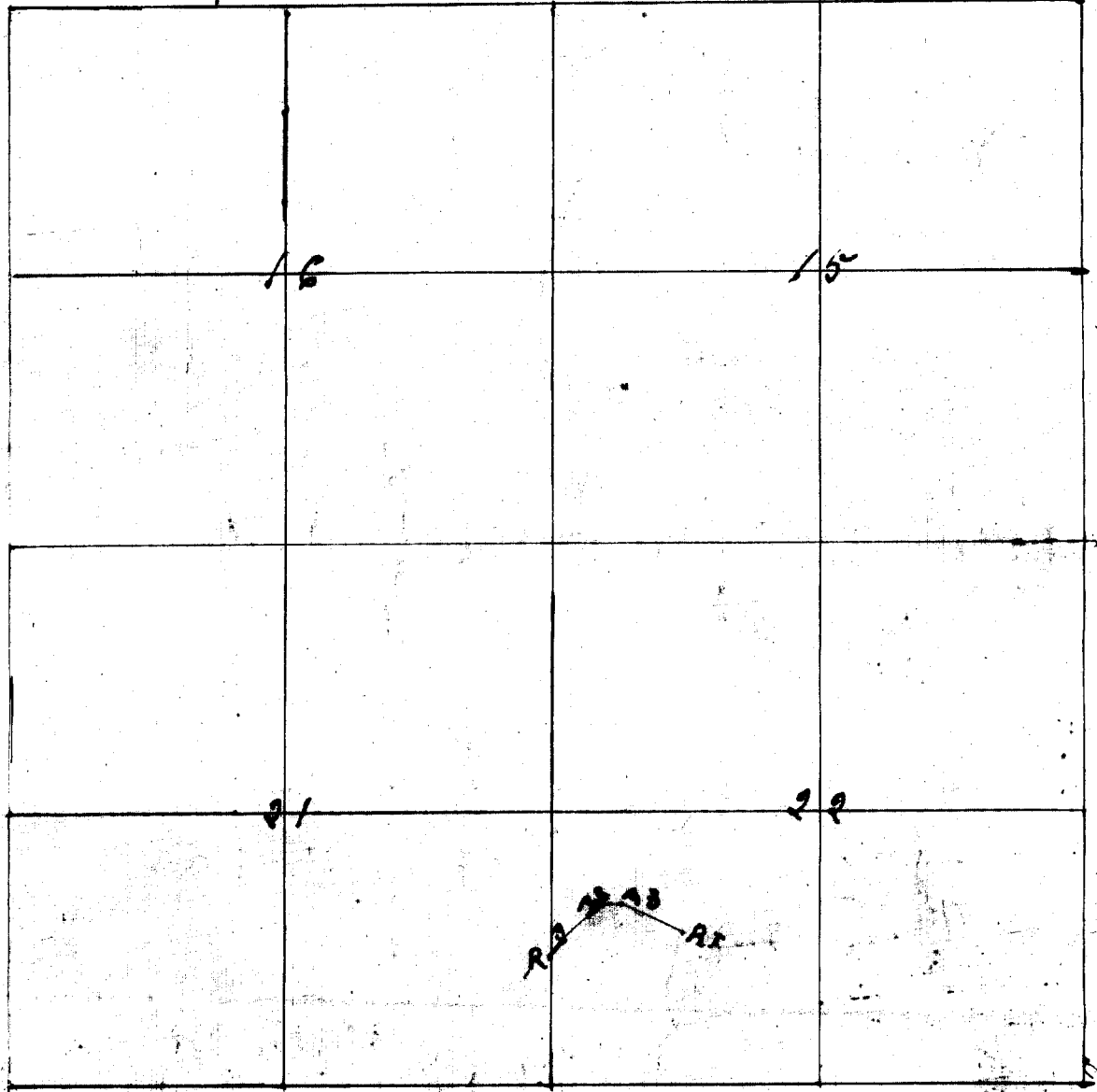

The undersigned viewers heretofore on the ~~29~~ day of Feb, 1895, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by Geo Walkman, et al, beg leave to report that on the 29 day of Feb, 1895, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county.

M.; thence angling North easterly about 400 yards intersecting said Road No. 81, near angle of said road as surveyed and platted in County records and there terminating; and to vacate the present County road between the points above mentioned. It is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that said report of the Viewers and surveyors be approved and adopted by the Court, and that said proposed road be declared a public highway of Union County, Oregon, and ordered open up and placed in repair for travel according to law. It is further ordered that the report of the Viewers be placed on record in this Journal, and that the Surveyors' plat of the proposed road and his field notes of the survey thereof, be placed on record in the book of Plats of County Roads of Union County, Oregon and that P. V. Davis, Road Supervisor of Road District No 20, the same being the road district in which said road is located, be furnished with a copy of the petition herein and accept of this decree, and ordered to examine and receive said road when opened up and placed in a good repair for travel as the old road seems to be vacated and allow the old road to be closed.
