3 That the petition does not describe the lines of the proposed road with sufficient certainty to give the Court jurisdiction, including the beginning, INTERMEDIATE POINTS, and terminal points with sufficient certainty.

4 That the notice of road petition here-in is insufficient to give the Court jurisdiction here-in, in this, that the said notice of road petition herein is undated and does not give the householders inspecting it full information of the intended proceeding.

5 That the proof of publication here-in is insufficient to give the Court jurisdiction, in that it does not describe the place where
