

The undersigned viewers heretofore on the 6 day of Dec, 1897, appointed to view and lay out and alter the proposed county road, of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by R. C. Munro, et al, beg leave to report that on the 21 day of Dec, 1897, in pursuance with said appointment and order, after being duly sworn to faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of said appointment, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinion said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county.

To The Hon. County Court of Union County, Oreg.

We the undersigned viewers duly appointed by the Hon. County Court of Union County Oregon, to meet on the 20th day of December 1897, met and adjourned until the 21st of December 1897, on which date we met and was duly sworn in by the County Surveyor, and did throw out and locate the proposed changes in the Old Meacham Road, according to our appointment. Would make this statement to the Hon. County Court: that we are favorable to the upper portion of the road, below Perry, and recommend the two bridges be built across the Grande Ronde River, but are not favorable to the lower change, leaving the County road at a point marked '08' on the County road, and running under the Railroad bridge, and terminating at a point on the County road at a cottonwood tree marked # 'xxx', as the said last change is expensive and not of public utility.

Commissioner Arnold was with us, and represents to us that the County Court have agreed to remove all railroad crossings below Perry, and in consideration for which the O R & N Ry. Co., are to assist in making said change. We would advise that the lower change be thrown out, provided the Railroad Co. will still assist the County in building the bridges, however, if such a compromise cannot be made with the Railroad Company without throwing out the whole proposition, we beg to have our report accepted as favorable.

We therefore hand our report in, duly signed, and ask the Court to look into this matter seriously before ordering the road opened. This is our judgement as tax payers, voters and citizens of Union County.
