Your petitioners being residents and householders within the County of Union -State of Oregon-and residing within the vicinity of where the hereinafter proposed road is to be laid out, hereby apply and petition your honorable body to lay-out, locate and establish a County Road-commencing at a point 80 rods

south of the south-west corner of the SW 1/4 of NE gr of Sec. 22 Twp 1, south of Range 39 E-(being the east end of the Striker Lane)-thence east to within 6 rods-more or less of the SE corner of the SW 1/4 of NE 1/4 Sec. 22;-thence in a northeasterly direction to Stake A; thence in a northerly direction to Stake B; thence in a northerly direction to stake C;- thence in a northerly direction to stake D; thence in an easterly direction to stake E; thence in easterly direction to stake F; thence in a southerly direction to a pine tree blazed on four sides; thence in a southerly direction to stake G;-thence in an easterly direction to stake H;-thence in an easterly direction to stake I; thence in an easterly direction to the north line of the S hf of NE 1/4 Sec. 23-to within 20 rods more or less of the NW corner of Twp 1 south Rge 39 E;- thence easterly across the creek; thence northerly to the north line of the south 1/2 of NE 1/4 of Sec. 23 Twp 1 south of Rge 40 E;- thence east on said line to Sec. 19-Twp 1 south of Rge 40 E;- thence south to half section line pf said section; thence east to 1/4 section line of said section; thence south to 1/4 corner-SW 1/4 of SW 1/4 of said section; thence east to half section line of Sec. 19-Twp 1 south of Rge 40 E; thence S-on half section line to NW cor of NW 1/4 of SE 1/4 Sec. 30-Twp 1 south of Rge 40 E;- thence east 1/8 mile; thence south on half mile section line to where it intersects the County Road-known as the Hamilton Road-all in Union County, Oregon-the same being the terminus of said proposed road.
