

The undersigned would respectively show that your petitioner some months ago signed his name to a petition asking for the laying out and establishing of a county road petitioned for by Guss Benggelsdorff, and others and which road was attempted to be layed out and established by the County Court according to said petition.

That the proceedings in establishing said road were set aside at the last term of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Union.

That your petitioner signed the said petition in ignorance of the facts and his rights as a petitioner thereunder. That petitioner was ignorant of the law in regard to establishing highways, and was told by parties who circulated the petition that the county desired the road and would be compelled to pay damages to any property through which the road passed.

That at that time it was understood the road would not cross over the premises of petitioner and he relying upon the statements made to him that damages would be paid by the county for all property taken for the purpose of the road, signed the petition in ignorance. That his so signing barred his rights to recover damages incurred on account of the road being located across his land.

That petitioner has little means and the location of the road as made causes great injuries and damages to him. In that it causes petitioner to build over one mile of extra fences and divides his land into two pieces.

WHEREFORE, petitioner asks that his name be stricken from the petition.





Review of proceedings in laying out County road.

There are three points raised by the writ, viz.- 1. That the petition does not sufficiently describe the terminating point; (2) that the road was not surveyed or viewed out by one authorized-(that is viewers not sworn and surveyor not one named.) (3) the surveyor's reporter is insufficient.

As to the first point I am of the opinion that the plaintiff, Geo. Gettle is precluded from questioning the jurisdiction, because he is a petitioner for the road; and the wife's interest in the H'd entry is only an inchoate right, if that, and not such as gives her standing to contest the road proceedings.

As to the second point, I am of the opinion, that as the law appoints the County surveyor to survey roads, unless absent or unable to do so, and the Court will take judicial knowledge of the County Surveyor, therefore his deputies may do the work in his place, including the administering the oath to the viewers. And as the record is silent on the question, whether J. L. Curtis was actually a deputy, and the matter having passed through the County Court without question, this Court cannot now question it. The matter is regular on its face.

As to the third point, as to the sufficiency of the surveyor's report, Section 4065 of the Code specifically de-

fines what he shall do in surveying and marking the road, and in making his return thereon. Every mile and the termini of the road must be specifically marked, and if one kind of corners cannot be established, then another may be used. The purpose of this is not only that the people travelling the road may see the marks, but that other surveyors may re-establish the angles or line of the road, as provided in section 4071, that there may be a record that will identify the road. And this must be done from the surveyor's return of the survey of the road. Therefore the surveyor in his notes of the survey give a specified designation of the establishment of the begining and termination, and termini of each mile, as well as the course and distances.

The survey must also show on its face that it complies with the petition. But in this case there is nothing to indicate where the survey terminates with reference to the termination mentioned in the petition.

Therefore, whatever may have been the work done on the ground by the surveyor, his return to the viewers is wholly insufficient under Section 4065 of the Code to identify the road, or authorize its establishment. And to that extent the writ should be sustained, and remanded to the lower Court for further proceedings thereon.
