Beginning on the County Road as near as practicable to the S.W. corner of the SE⁴ SE⁴ Sec 19, getting on to the line between the East and West halves SE⁴ Sec 19, as near as practicable, Thence North to the NW corner NE⁴ SE⁴ Sec 19, Thence West to the SW corner NE⁴ Sec 19, Thence North to the NW corner SE⁴ Sec 18, Thence West to the SW corner NW⁴ Sec 18, Thence North to the County Road at the N.W. corner NW⁴ Sec 18, T 3 & R 39 E 6 W

Sawney to a stake near the section line between sections 44 x 5, 47 x 5 of R 39 E 2 W, thence in a southerly direction upon the course of the section line between said sections 44 x 5, 47 x 5 R 39 E 2 W, a distance of about one eighth of a mile to a point where the said section line intersects the present County road leading from Union to Talpaud, known as the East Hill road and there terminating, and appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by more than twelve householders of this County residing in the vicinity of said proposed road, and that said petition properly specifies the place of beginning, intermediate points and place of termination of said road, and it satisfactorily appearing to the Court that notice has been given by advertisement pasted at the place of holding County Court, to wit: At the Court House in the town of Union, County of Union, State of Oregon, and also in three public places in the vicinity of said proposed road, to wit: one on a board nailed to the rail fence near the gate opening into W. P. Wright's field at the beginning of the proposed road, one on new bridge over Catherine Creek on the line of the proposed road and one on a board nailed to the fence at the terminus of the proposed road for more than thirty days immediately prior to the presentation of said petition to this Court, notifying all persons concerned that application would be made to this Court at the present term of this Court; and that the notices so posted were in due form and duly signed by the petitioners, and that a bond for the cost of this proceeding has been duly given.

It is therefore, ordered that M. B. Rees, Geo. Holmes and Geo. P. Hillman be appointed owners of said road and that Arthur Curtis be appointed Surveyor of said road and that they meet at the farm residence of W. P. Wright on the 25th day of November, 1901 at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M. and after qualifying to view, survey and lay out said road according to law—

And it appearing to the Court from the protest filed herein that sufficient causes exist for the dismissal of said petition. It is therefore considered and ordered that the said protest and motion to dismiss the petition be and the same hereby is granted.

Whereupon it was ordered that Court be now adjourned until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock.
