

I, the undersigned, County Surveyor, appointed to survey the county road proposed by ^{of Public Enclosure} Joseph Farate et al., beg leave to report that on the 21st day of April 1802, in pursuance of said appointment and order, I Surveyed said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, the following being the field notes of said survey:


