

This matter came on to be heard at this time for the appointment of a Superintendent for the County Poor Farm for the ensuing year, and it appearing to the Court that this matter has been continued from the January Term and that now is the proper time to let the contract for the keeping and caring for the inmates of the County Poor Farm. And it further appearing to the Court that bids have been submitted for care and keeping of said inmates by M. Drinn, Thomas Graham, E. G. Miller, & J. W. Ferguson, at \$300 per week for each inmate confined therein; and further that in the event of the death of any of the inmates of said Hospital that a proper burial would be given each at \$15<sup>00</sup>. And it further appearing to the Court that all the bids for said keeping and care of the County Poor Farm and inmates are at and for the same amounts, and it further appearing to the Court that the application and bid of M. Drinn is a fair and equitable bid and that he is a fit and proper person for such appointment. He is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that M. Drinn be and he is hereby appointed Superintendent of the County Poor for a period of One Year, commencing March 1, 1903 upon his furnishing a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$1000<sup>00</sup>.

At this time is presented to the Court the resignation of J. H.
