That the aforesaid respective amounts and elements of damage will have to be expended and suffered on account of the laying out of said road and not otherwise, and if said road were not lain out none of the said damage and expenditures would be suffered or made.

That should a bridge be constructed across on said road sufficiently high to permit the free and unobstructed passage from one field across the said road to the other fields it would necessarily on account of the spring freshets ever-flooding said land, have to be constructed from the natural surface of the ground, seven feet high and thirty feet wide, and which would cost not less than \$200.00; and that the construction of said passage way for stock, etc. would not in any manner or form lessen the damage sustained.

That the amount in dollars ^{and} cents of the benefits to be derived from the opening and laying out of said road is nothing, and would not lessen the amount of damage sustained by the said Peach Bros.

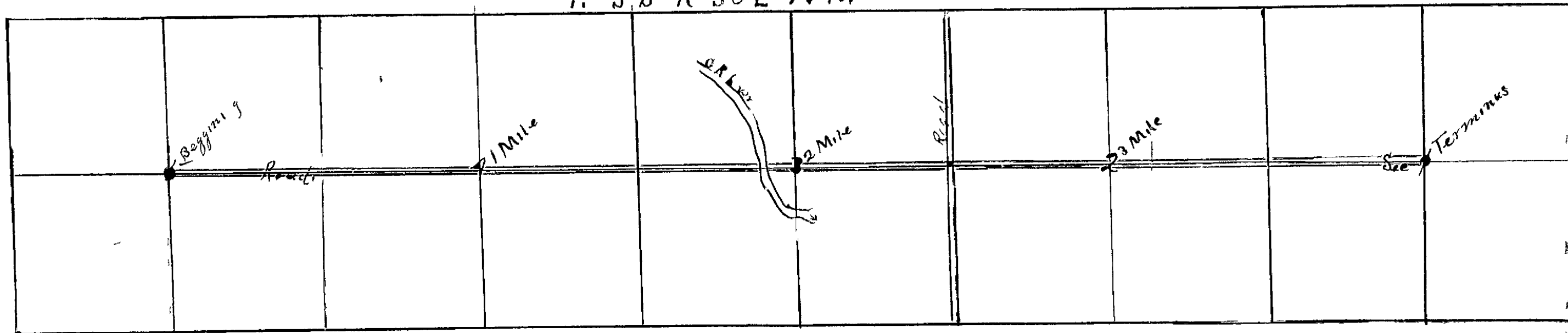
