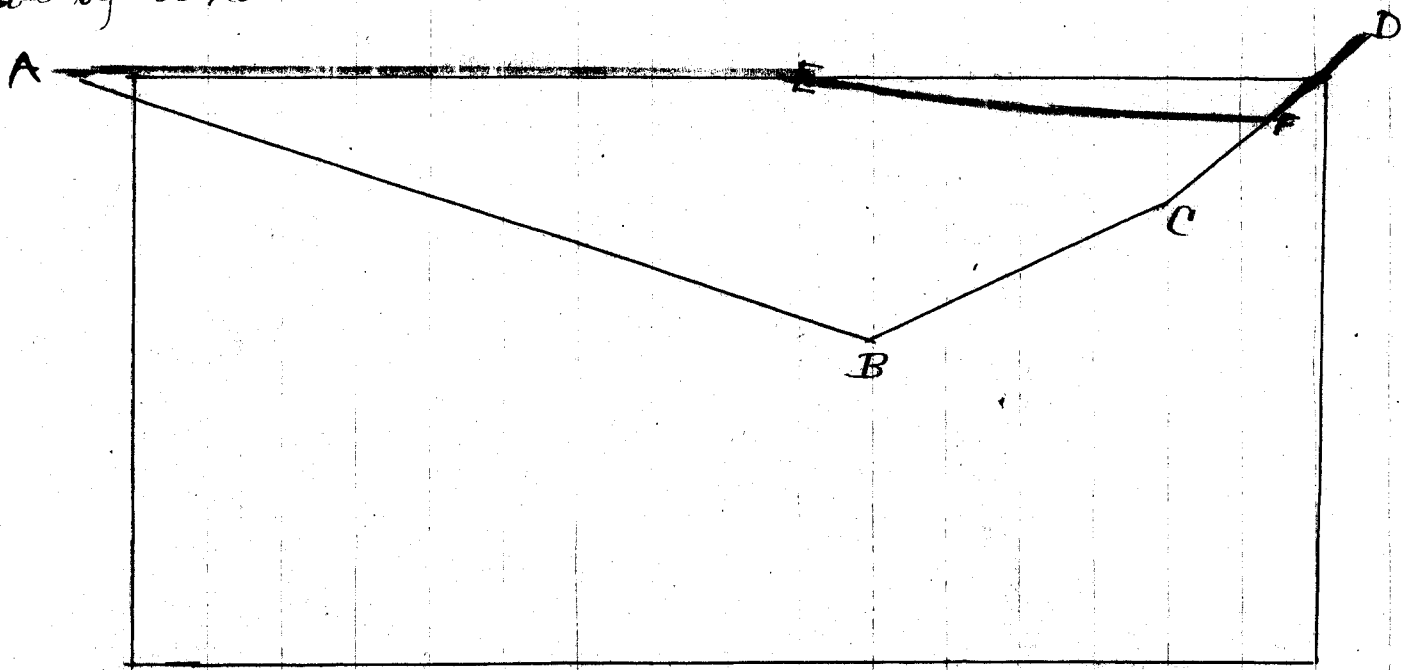

The black line A.B.C.D. shows where a public road crosses the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, T. 5, S, R. 39 E, W. M.

The red line A.E.F.D. shows, approximately, where it is desired to have said road moved, shortening the road and putting it as good ground as at present, all expenses to be borne by the owner of above described property. Reason for wishing said change is to be able to include the tillable land in one body and not have it cut in two by the road as at present.

To The Honorable County Court of
Union County, Oregon.

Gentlemen.

Having recently filed upon a homestead
and wishing to fence the same preparatory
to putting in a crop this year, if possible,
I desire to change a portion of the public
road which now crosses my claim, and
remove it a short distance north of its
present position. I agree to do all the
work necessary to make the new road
as good as the present one and, as
may be seen, from the accompanying
plat, the new road will be shorter
than the old. If required by the Court
I will survey, or have surveyed, the
proposed new route, so as to give all
necessary angles and bearings for
the purpose of recording the same,
and will bear all expense of the
change of said road.

Gentlemen.

I herewith submit to your
honorable body, as requested, a plat of
the road as I wish it located on my
property in Section 3, T S, R 39 E, W.M.

I have not yet done the work on the
new road but will do it as soon as I
can and, meanwhile, the old road will
be left open until the new one is
approved. Comparisons with the road map
will show that the proposed new road is
much shorter than the old one, and
when it is completed it will be found to
have easier grades and equally as good
if not better road bed than the present one.

Thence, making such an angle northerly,
that, at 1436 feet, the road is 75 feet
south of said N line.
Thence, making such an angle northerly,
that, at 1483 feet, the road again coincides
with said N line.
Thence, eastward, along said N line, until,
at 1926 feet, from the beginning, the road
intersects the old road where it crosses
the said N line.

Note. The fine blue line, A B, represents the N. line of the tract on which I have asked leave to locate the new road, moving it further north than its present location.
