

In the matter Of the resignation of W. B. Gassett, as Supervisor of Road Dist #24.

At this time is presented to the Court the resignation of WO B. Gasset, as Supr ervisor of Road District #24, and it appearing to the Court that sadd Supervisor can not give the duties of his office the attention that it requires without interfering with his personal business and that it would be to the best interest of the Dist rict that said resignation be accepted. IT IS THERFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED by th Court that said resignation be accepted and that the office of Supervosor of Road District #24 be and the same is hereby declared vacant .

In the matter of the appointment of a Supervisor for Road District #24.

It appearing to the Court at this time that a vacabcy exists in the office of Supervisor of Road District #24, by reason of the resignation of W. B. Gasset as Supervisor ofsaid Read District, And it further appearing to the Court that some suitable person who is a residen t and taxpayer of said Road district should be appointed to fill said vacancy; that Ed Boswell is a resident Tax-payer of said District and a fit and proper person for such appointment. IT IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED AND ORDERED That Ed Boswell be and he is hereby appointed Supervisor of Road District #24, upon his filing a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$500.00, and oath of Office.

Tibbetts, one of the petitioners for the above named proposed County road and presents to the Court the petition of himself and others, praying for the location and establishment of a county road, described as follows, to-wit; Commencing at a stake marked (1) set in the center of the present public highway at a

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point 245 rods southeasterly measuring along said public highway from the northwest corner of section thirty (30) township one (1) north, range forty (40) East of Willamette Meridian, running thence up Clark's Creek on the most practicable route to a stake marked "2" set at a point three rods east of the northeast corner of section five (5) township one (1) south of range forty (40) east of Willamette Meridian, thence southeasterly over the most practical route to the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of section ten 10 township one (1) south of range forty (40) east of Willamette Meridian, and there to terminate.
