Comes now John L. Ross, the petitioner for the above named proposed road of ______easement, and presents to the Court the petition of himself, praying for the location _____eand establishment of a road of public easement of private necessity described as follows to-wit:

Commencing at the N.E. Corner of the South half, S.W. 1/4, Sec. 27, Township 1, N.R. 38, E.W.M., running directly east across the land of Bert Slack, and entersecting the public highway of or near the N.E. Corner of the South half, S.E. 1/4 Sec. 27, Township 1, N.R. 38, E.W.M. Said road to be 25 feet wide.

It appears from the petition herein that J.L. Ross is the owner in fee of the S. half of the S.W. 1/4 Section 27, Tp. 1, N.R. 38, E.W.M., having his residence thereon, and that his residence is not reached by any public highway, but he is required to pass across the lands of Bert Slack to get to the public highway, and that the petitioner's land hereinbefore described is situated within 80 rods of a public highway on the east, and that a good road could be maintained across the land of Bert Slack, said land being described as follows, to-wit: S.E. 1/4 of Sec. 27, Tp. 1, N.R. 38, E.W.M.

And it further appearing to the Court that the proposed public easement is necessary and would add greatly to the convenience of said petitioner,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Arthur Curtis, County Surveyor, and B. Logsdon and E.B. Morelock, constituting the Board of County Road Viewers, be and they are hereby directed to meet at the beginning of said proposed public easement on the 23" day of September, 1905, or within five days thereafter, and proceed to survey, view and lay out said road according to law.

Thereupon it was ordered that Court be now adjourned until tomorrow morning, September 8th, 1905, at 10 o'clock.

Now Therefore, in accordance with the said order of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Union, made in said cause, it is Hereby ORDERED that the Orders and Decrees made and entered in said cause on the Sth day of June, 1905, ordering P.A. McDonald, Road Supervisor of Road District No. 37, to open up said road and place the same in repair for travel upon the payment into this Court by the petitioners the sum of Twenty-five Dollars damages as assessed by the Board of County Road Viewers the Order made and entered in said cause on the 9th day of June, A.D., 1905, accepting Twenty Five Dollars from the petitioners damages assessed by the Board of County Road Viewers and declaring that said proposed road to be a public highway of Union County, Oregon, be and they are hereby set aside and declared null and void. And it is further ORDERED and DECREED that the said cause be and is hereby placed upon the Docket of this Court for consideration herein.

This matter came to be heard at this time on the report of the Board of County Road Viewers for a second reading, as provided by law, said report being in words following to-wit:

REPORT OF BOARD OF COUNTY ROAD VIEWERS.

To the Honorable County CouRt of Union County, Oregon:

The undersigned Board of County Road Viewers heretofore on the 6" day of September, 1905, instructed to view, lay out and alter the proposed county road of public
easement of which the survey hereto attached is a true and correct description, as petitioned for by J.L. Ross, beg leave to report that on the 23rd day of September, 1905, in
pursuance with said order, we proceeded to view out said proposed road of public easement for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinions said proposed road should
be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same
is practicable and would add to the convenience of the householders residing in the
vicinity thereof.

We therefore recommend that said proposed road of public easement be laid out and declared a public highway of said county and that by the location of said road 25 feet wide there will be a damage to the property owners to the amount of \$200.00.

This matter came on to be heard at this time upon the awarding the contract for insuring the City Hall for a term of three years.

It is Hereby CONSIDERED and ORDERED that J.W. Oliver be awarded the contract of writing \$4000 of insurance upon the City Hall for a period of three years on the terms and conditions above specified. And it further appearing to the Court that all other bids were the same, being \$1.40 per hundred or \$2.80 per hundred for a term of three years,

ed upon the City Hall, to-wit: \$10,000, be and the same is hereby divided equally between the following named agents, to-wit: C.J. Scriber \$2000; W.B. Sargent, \$2000; J.R. Oliver \$2000; Church & Newlin \$2000 and Williams Bros. \$2000.

Now at this time this cause came on for hearing upon the motion of petitioners, appearing by J.D. Slater of counsel, their attorney, for an order substituting copies of the original petition, notice and affidavits of posting in place of the lost originals thereof; and it appearing to the Court that the original petition, filed on the 5th day of April 1905, the notice of road petition with two affidavits of posting filed on April 5th, 1905, have been mislaid and lost from the proper files and cannot be found; and it also appearing that copies of said petition, notice and affidavits are now of record in the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Union County in the case of Dillie Randall vs. Union County, in which case the records of this cause including such petition, notice and affidavits were certified to the said Circuit Court by the Clerk of this Court; and it also appearing that petitioners now offer for filing and substitution in place of such originals, copies thereof; It is therefore ORDERED that the said copies of the said original petition, notice of Road petition, and affidavits showing posting of such notice be and the same are hereby substituted in place of the lost originals.

And this cause coming on at this time for final determination of the court upon the Report of the County Road Viewers in this cause and it appearing to the Court that said report is favorable and recommends the establishment of said proposed Road as surveyed and laid out as a public highway, the petitioners to pay the damages in the sum of \$100.00 assessed by the Board to and in favor of George Miller; and it further appearing that all the proceedings herein have been and are regular and that the same have been examined and approved by the District Attorney, and that said proposed road is not of sufficient public utility to warrant the Court in ordering said damages to be paid by the County; It is
