And it appearing to the Court that said petition is signed by more than twelve freeholders of this County, residing in the road district where the hereinbefore described road is proposed to be, and that said petition properly specifies the place of beginning, intermediate points and place of termination of said road, and it satisfactorily appearing to the Court that notice has been given by advertisement posted at the place of holding County Court, to-wit: At the Court House in the city of La Grande, County of Union, State of Oregon, and also in three public places in the vicinity of said proposed road, to-wit:
