





to the prejudice of the plaintiffs, in locating and establishing a certain road of public

easement petition for by S.H.Richards, and declaring the same a public road and in ordering the same recorded as such made and entered in said Court on the 7th day of June, 1907, the two Writs and causes having been consolidated and united for the purpose of a hearing and

judgment herein, the same came regularly on to be heard at this time the plaintiffs appearing by C.H.Finn of counsel, and the defendant Union County, and the District Attorney, F.S.Ivanhoe

and said S.H.Richards, appearing not, either in person or by attorney, although each of them was duly notified and cited to appear herein, and the Court having heard the argument of counsel for the plaintiffs and being now fully advised in the premises finds that there was

error in the proceedings of the Board of County Road Viewers in their action in pretending to locate said road and in assessing and failing to assess damages to the owners of the land through which said road is located, the plaintiffs herein, and in their report to said County

Court and in the action of said County Court in approving and accepting said report and in declaring said road a public road of Union County, Oregon, to the manifest prejudice, injury

and damage of the plaintiffs and each of them;

It is therefore ORDERED and ADJUDGED that said writs of review be, and the same are here now sustained and that the said report of the viewers upon the said road of public easement so petitioned for by said S.H.Richards and the action of the said County Court in approving and accepting the same and in declaring said road a public road of Union County, Oregon, be and the same are here now set aside, annulled and held for naught, and the said County Court is hereby directed to proceed in said matter anew as though said view-

ers had not been appointed or said report or orders thereon made, and in accordance with the law as defined in the opinion filed herein.

It is further CONSIDERED, ORDERED and ADJUDGED that plaintiffs have and recover their costs and disbursements herein.
