

Dinsmore et al., beg leave to report that on the 13 day of June, 1908, in pursuance with said order, we proceeded to view out said proposed road for the whole distance thereof, and that in our opinions said proposed road should be laid out and established as a public highway of Union County, Oregon; that the same is practicable and would add greatly to the convenience of the householders residing in the vicinity thereof. We therefore recommend that said proposed road be laid out and declared a public highway of said county.
